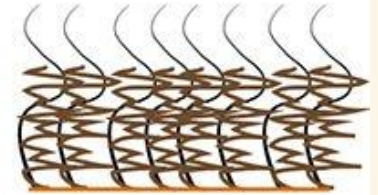

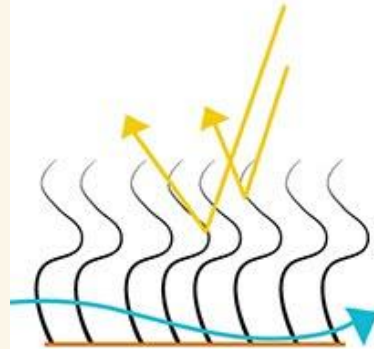
Coat, freshly groomed
and free from undercoat.



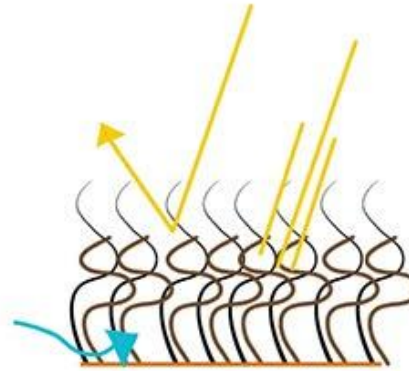
Coat with moderate undercoat.



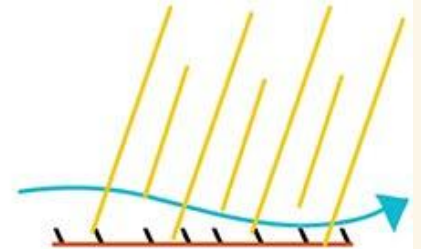
Coat with impacted undercoat.



Cool air can reach the skin
and circulate when
undercoat and mats are
removed. The sun's rays will
bounce off the coat.



Cool air is blocked when
the undercoat starts
growing in, causing the dog to
overheat. The undercoat
will absorb the rays due to
a more porous structure,
trapping the heat in.



When the coat is shaved the
cool air flows above the skin.
The sun's rays penetrate
whatever thin hair is left,
causing the dog to overheat.
Since a dog's skin is only
6-10 layers deep (compared to
a human's 16-20) they will
easily sunburn.
